Photograph of Mozart's Widow Is Found

A print of the only photograph of Mozart's widow, Constanze, has been found in the archives of Altötting, a German town, the BBC reported. In 1840, when the original daguerreotype was made, Constanze was 78; she died in 1842. Mozart died at 35 in 1791, when she was 29. (She later married a Danish diplomat.) Authorities in Altötting, in Bavaria, said a detailed examination of the image had established its authenticity. The picture, right, was taken outside the home of Max Keller,



a Swiss composer whom Constanze regularly visited. It shows her at front left next to Keller; his wife, Josefa, is on the right; in the back row are the Kellers' daughters on the right, Keller's brother-in-law Philipp Lattner and the family's cook.
